Entries and Entry Closing Dates for Regionals Entries for Regional Maclay Championship classes close, and must be received by, 5:00 p.m. Eastern Time, September 1, at the NHSAA's office, except if that date should fall on a Sunday, in which case they must be received no later than 5 p.m. on the following Monday.

Entries must be on the Official Entry Form, signed, and submitted with the \$150.00 per class Entry Fee made payable to the NHSAA. The NHSAA reserves the right to reject any late or unsigned entries or entries not submitted with all entry fees. Entries may not be accepted directly by any Regionals competition. Entry and class lists for Regionals shall be provided by the NHSAA to competitions hosting Regionals no later than 48 hours preceding the commencement of the class. Stall reservations and all other entry and class fees, including competition and processing fees for other classes which might be held during the same competition, must be provided directly to the competition hosting the Regionals.

Riders are to be judged on seat, hands, guidance and control of horse. Two refusals will eliminate a rider from Regionals competition. After completion of the jumping phase, if available, a minimum of ten (10) more riders than one-half the number of riders competing in the Regionals are required to show at a walk, trot and canter. At the sole discretion of the judges, additional flat work may be called for, but all groups must be asked to perform the same tests. No more than twenty (20) riders at a time may be asked to work together in a group at the same time. The flat performance of those riders selected to show in the flat phase shall count 50%. After the flat phase the Judges may request further testing using USEF tests 1-18. Riders may only be selected for further testing if after the flat phase they are already assured an invitation (based on percentages) to compete in the Finals.

The Judges will select a Champion, Reserve Champion, and Third through Tenth place finishers at each Regionals. In addition, the judges will create, in order of placing, a stand-by list of all other competitors with the possibility of qualifying for the Finals. This stand-by list will be announced publicly, made available to all competitors

#### GENERAL RULES AND REUGLATIONS

1. Every class offered here in which is covered by the rules and specification of the current USEF Rule Book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.

2. Exhibitors must be in proper riding attire and wear protective headgear.

3. Hunter classes to be judged on soundness and performance. Any additional specification to be

noted. Trophy and eight ribbons awarded in every class, unless otherwise noted.

4. Prize money will be mailed by check within 30 days. The Horse Showwill not stop payment or duplicate awards for lost checks.

5. Stabling availableon a first come, first servebasis.Stall provided under clear span tent and are 10'x10'. Stall Fee: \$295.00

6. An office fee of \$50.00 will be assessed to every entry. Scratch fee \$50. Post entry fee \$25.

7. An entry may be scratched by written notice with the show secretary and a \$50.00 processing fee will be accessed. Once the show has started, horses that are not shown in classes in which they are entered will forfeit their entry fees.

8. A fine of \$50.00 plus collection fees will be assessed for all non-negotiable checks. Foreign competitors are required to pay in US funds to avoid discount charges.

9. Ring dimension sand footing: Hedgering 140' x 250', June Road ring 150' x 300',

Indoorring 114' x 195'. Footinginall rings is sand/fiber mix.

10. If jumping orders are to be used, the horse's names will be drawn individually starting with the first position then working down. Orders will be announced and posted one hour before the class. A dotted line may be instituted to limit the size of opening circles if entries require.

11. The Management reserves the right to cancel, combine or split any class if entries warrant or the rules of the USEF require it and to limit the number of entries accepted, which will be done on a first come first serve basis. Postentries will be accepted if time allows.

12. Every animal entered for competition or on the show grounds shall be under the control of the horse show committee. Old Salem Farm and/or its employees shall not be liable or responsible for any loss or damageto any animal, person or property, which may occur for any reason during the show and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor hold Old Salem Farm, its owners, agents, employees and the USEF blameless for any accident or loss which may occur.

13. No dogs or other pets allowed on the grounds unless leashed and under control.

14. Measurements to be done by Miller & Associates by appointment with horse show office. Usually10:00AM.

15. LIFE, SENIOR ACTIVE, JUNIOR ACTIVE MEMBERS SHALL BE ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN ALL CLASSES AT REGULAR MEMBER COMPETITIONS, COMBINE TRAINING AT THE PRELIMINARY LEVEL OR ABOVE AND COMBINED DRIVING EVENTS AT THE INTERMEDIATE LEVEL OR ABOVE, DRESSAGE AND VAULTING COMPETITIONS AND ENDURANCE RIDES PROVIDED THE RESPECTIVE BREED/DISCIPLINE DUES OR

BRIDEE/DISCIPLINE CATEGORY FEE HAS BEEN PAID. A NON-MEMBER MAY PARTICIPATE AS A HANDLER, RIDER, DRIVER, OWNER, LESSEE, AGENT, COACH OR TRAINER AT REGULAR MEMBER COMPETITIONS, COMBINED TRAINING/EVENTING COMPETITIONS, DRESSAGE COMPETITIONS AND COMBINED DRIVING COMPETITIONS UPON PAYMENT OF A \$45.00 SHOW PASS FEE. PARTICIPANTS IN THE FOLLOWING CLASSES ARE EXEMPT FROM THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS RULE: 1. LEADLINE; 2. EXHIBITIONS; 3. GAMES AND RACES 4. CLASSES FOR 4-H MEMBERS AND 5. WALKTROTAND ACADEMY CLASSES (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6. USDF INTRODUCTORY LEVEL TESTS, PAS DE DEUX AND QUADRILLE CLASSES. ALSO EXEMPT FROM THIS REQUIREMENT ARE CITIZENS OF OTHER NATIONS WHO HAVE PROOF IN ENGLISH, OF CURRENT MEMBERSHIP IN GOOD STANDING OF THEIR OWN NATIONAL FEDERATION, AND 7. USEA BEGINNER NOVICE DIVISION; AND 8. ASSISTANT HANDLERS IN DRESSAGE SPORT HORSE BREEDING CLASSES.

7. Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized ve-hicle in the state in which they reside will inot be perm itted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motori zed vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as а parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in vio- lation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions re- sulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assis- tance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from thisrule.

By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaulter or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of the Competition. I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the Competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the Competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the Competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4
