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RULES AND REGULATIONS

Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current usef rule book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith. All measurement cards, amateur cards, necessary association numbers and signatures must appear on all entry blanks, accompanied by a form of payment, before any entry will be processed and rider number given out.

1. Entries close **August 21, for the Old Salem Farm Horse Shows**. All entries received after August 21, 2025 will be considered late and be charged **\$100.00 per late entry**. No phone entries will be accepted. **No faxed entries will be accepted.** Stall fees must be paid by the closing date of entries. Credit Cards accepted Visa, MasterCard and American Express. Credit card payments will be charged a 4% convenience fee. For prize list and horse show information from 9:00 AM-5:00 PM: Phone (914) 669-5610. Every entry will be charged a \$115.00 office fee.

2. A Ship-In fee of \$100.00 will be assessed to those entries who are showing but not purchasing a stall. This is a one-time fee.

3. **Temporary stabling available: Stalls \$435.00, which must be paid in full by the closing date of entries. The stalls are under tents and are vinyl type with doors. No initial bedding provided. Stabling is limited, so Management reserves the right to limit the number of tack and/or grooming stalls assigned. Due to strict fire regulations, NO EXTENSION CORDS ALLOWED! No refunds on stalls after the closing date of entries. NYS Sales tax will be charged where applicable. Stable flooring is grass/dirt.**

4. USEF IHP Fees: All Riders competing in any FEI sanctioned class are subject to USEF International High Performance rule see USEF GR 207 for fees due to the Federation and will be paid as part of the total FEI fee.

5. Stable & Schooling: Early arrivals prior to September 8, 2025 12:00 noon, must contact Stable Manager to make check in arrangements.

6. Scratches: A horse scratched prior to closing of entries will receive a full refund.

Hunter and Equitation Horses: Once past the closing date of entries, horses may be scratched by written notice to the Show Secretary one hour prior to the start of the section being scratched. Once the show has started, horses which are not shown in classes in which they are entered will forfeit their entry fees. Once a horse has shown, in order to qualify for a refund of individual "Per Class" entries, a scratch sheet must be filled out and presented to the Show Secretary accompanied by a certificate signed by the Show Veterinarian. Once a horse has shown in any one class of a division which requires a "Division Only" entry, division fees will not be refunded. When this process is complete, the class entry fee will be refunded or credited less a \$115.00 office fee. Nominated jumpers: Once past the closing date of entries, horses may be scratched by written notice to the Show Secretary one hour prior to the classes being scratched. Nomination fee and class entry fee will be refunded or credited less a \$115.00 office fee. **No refunds on stalls after the closing date of entries.** Show Scratch Fee after closing date: \$200.00

7. Ring dimensions and footing: Hedge Ring 140' x 250', June Road Ring 150' x 250', Indoor Ring 114' x 195'; Footing in all rings and schooling areas is drainage mats, sand and fiber mix. International Arena 350' x 450'.

8. Poling & Animal Welfare: Manual poling and/or the use of bamboo pole offsets are prohibited. Any rider or trainer found poling or using offsets and/or who, in the opinion of the judges or committee, uses their whip or spurs in an excessive manner will be immediately eliminated from the class where the incident occurred, be suspended from further showing for a twenty-four hour period and will forfeit all entry fees for that class. Any horse upon which a violation of the manual poling and/or use of bamboo offset rule is perpetrated will be suspended from competition for a twenty-four hour period starting from the time of incident and forfeit all entry fees. Further violations by that exhibitor on the same horse or another horse will result in said exhibitor being barred from any further competition at this Show.

All incidents will be reported by USEF Stewards to the USEF for possible further investigations.

9. Formal attire for Hunter classes: scarlet, black or dark blue coat; white shirt with white stock, tie, or choker; white, buff, or canary breeches; hunt cap, derby or hunting silk hat. Formal attire for Jumper classes: scarlet, black, dark blue or dark green coat; white shirt with white stock, tie or choker; white, fawn or canary breeches; hunt cap; black or brown boots. Hard hats must be worn at all times while riding and juniors must wear protective headgear in accordance with USEF Rules.

10. Prize money will be mailed in the form of a check, **made payable to the owner or other designee listed on the entry blank**, no later than 30 days after the last show day. A U. S. Social Security or Federal ID number is required before any prize money will be paid. Checks void after 60 days and the Horse Show will not stop payment or duplicate awards for any lost check.

11. A fine of \$100.00 plus collection fees, will be assessed for all non-negotiable checks. Foreign competitors are required to pay in US funds to avoid discount charges.

12. The Management reserves the right to cancel, combine or split any class if entries warrant or the rules of the USEF require it. The Management also reserves the right to: limit the number of entries accepted, which will be done on a first come, first serve basis; change the location of any classes and to alter courses and/or fences if necessary; to decline any entry before the start of the show without being liable for compensation; change the start times of any ring from what is indicated on time schedule.

13. The Management reserves the right to restrict the area of the courtesy circle by Mandatory Line which will be indicated on course diagrams and posted at least one hour before the class is to begin. Jumping orders will be established in accordance with USEF JP112 where the horses names will be drawn individually starting with the first position then working down. Riders who have conflicts should see the Starters so that necessary adjustments can be made.

14. Parking provided on the Show grounds only in areas designated by Management. Campers, motor homes and trailers cannot be accommodated on the Show grounds. Except for "day-trippers", horse trailers, vans, etc. will be allowed on the grounds only for loading and unloading.

15. No Dogs or other pets allowed on the grounds unless they are leashed and under control. Unrestrained pets will be impounded and released only upon payment of a \$100.00 fine.

16. **Equine Health Requirements/Protocols: All horses (competing or not) that enter the grounds must have available for inspection: Negative Coggins within one year (required) and a statement of health signed and dated by a licensed veterinarian within 7 days of arrival of Old Salem Farm Show Grounds. The statement of health must show the horse/pony has been enrolled in a regular and consistent program of vaccination against EHV-1 with the most recent booster being within 180 days. The statement of health must state that the horse/pony have not shown symptoms of or been treated for EHV-1 in the past 28 days nor has been exposed to any horse/pony being treated for or show symptoms of EHV-1. Horses traveling**

toms of or been treated for EHV-1 in the past 28 days nor has been exposed to any horse/pony being treated for or show symptoms of EHV-1. Horses traveling from other than New York State require a certificate of health. Every animal entered for competition or on the show grounds, shall be under the control of the Horse Show Management. Old Salem Farm, its owners, employees, agents, show committee and sponsors shall not be liable or responsible for any loss or damage to any animal, person or property, which may occur for any reason during the show and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor hold Old Salem Farm, its owners, agents, employees and the USEF blameless for any accident or loss which may occur by fire or otherwise.

17. Should any question or dispute arise not provided for in these rules, the decision of the Horse Show Management shall be final and adhered to by the agreement of a signed entry blank.

18. All exhibitors in the Pony and Junior Hunter divisions must present their measurement cards at the office before numbers are released. All Pony or Junior Hunters who do not possess a current measurement card will be measured at a time and place to be announced. PLEASE INCLUDE COPIES OF MEASUREMENT CARDS WITH ENTRIES TO FACILITATE PROCESSING. Fairfield Equine will measure each day at 10:00 AM

19. Federation Entry agreement By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaultor or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of Old Salem Farm (Competition). I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable-casts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$45 Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR222) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in the classes); 6) training; 7) USEF Introductory level tests of side English and quadrille exercises; 8) NRHA Endorsement Refining Competition; 9) USEF Introductory level tests of side English and quadrille exercises; 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

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Course

The course for each Regionals shall be designed by a USEF Course Designer who must be selected and/or approved by the NHSAA. Any Regionals course must adhere to the above stated specifications and be of sufficient difficulty to typify the Finals and reflect the importance of the class. While the courses at all Regionals need not be identical, they should reflect equal difficulty and challenge.

Judging

Each Regionals shall have two (2) "R" Judges. One of these judges must be selected from the approved list of judges supplied by the NHSAA. The second judge is not required to be selected from this list but must be approved by the NHSAA. Judges for the Finals are ineligible to judge any Regionals in the same year.

Riders are to be judged on seat, hands, guidance, and control of horse.

Two refusals will eliminate a rider from Regionals competition.

Use of the open numerical system of judging not to be used.

After completion of the jumping phase, if available, a minimum of ten (10) more riders than one-half the number of riders competing in the Regionals are required to show at a walk, trot and canter. At the sole discretion of the judges, additional flat work may be called for, but all groups must be asked to perform the same tests. No more than twenty (20) riders at a time may be asked to work together in a group at the same time. The flat performance of those riders selected to show in the flat phase shall count 50%. Changing of bit/bridle between phases is permissible.

After the flat phase the Judges may request further testing using USEF tests 1-23. Riders may only be selected for further testing if after the flat phase they are already assured an invitation (based on percentages) to compete in the Finals.

The Judges will select a Champion, Reserve Champion, and Third through Tenth place finishers at each Regionals. In addition, the judges will determine a stand-by list of all the additional entrants who returned for the flat phase. This stand-by list will be announced publicly, made available to all competitors, and emailed to the NHSAA office.

When the Regionals are completed, and the riders qualified for the Finals have been selected the judge's cards will be immediately sealed. The judge's cards, class sheet, jump order, official results sheet and a detailed copy of the course diagram will be emailed directly to the NHSAA office.

HAMEL FOUNDATION NHS 3'3"

Riders qualified for the Hamel Foundation NHS 3'3" Equitation Championship may also enter and compete in any Regional competition provided they have met their state point requirement from competing in Maclay classes in the same competition year. Please refer to ASPCA Maclay class specifications for full details.

HAMEL FOUNDATION 3'3" EQUITATION FINALS

Judging

To be judged on seat, hands, guidance, and control of the horse.

First Round

To be shown over a special course of jumps set to the above stated specifications and posted one hour before the start of the class. The course for the Finals shall be designed by a USEF Course Designer who must be selected and/or approved by the NHSSA. The Judges for the Finals will have input and give approval on the course design.

Flat Phase

A minimum of twenty-four (24) riders, if available, are required to show at a walk, trot, and canter. At the sole discretion of the judges, additional flat work may be called for, but all groups must be asked to perform the same tests. No more than twenty (20) riders at a time may be asked to work together. The flat performance of those riders selected to show in the flat phase shall count 50%. Changing of bit/bridle between phases is permissible.

Second Round

All riders who competed in the Flat Phase will be asked to return for a final round over a second course following the above listed specifications. The second-round course may include tests.

Testing

Testing of up to six riders is optional using USEF Tests 1-23.

Conditions for Hamel Foundation NHS 3'3" Medal Finals

The Finals is open only to junior members of the USEF who have not reached their 18th birthday in accordance with GR127 and who have never competed in any of the following National Equitation Finals with fences at 3'6" or higher: ASPCA Maclay Finals, US Medal Finals, USEF Talent Search (East or West), WIHS Equitation Classic Finals, Jump Canada Medal Finals, or the North American Equitation Championship. Previous winners of the Hamel Foundation National Horse Show 3'3" Equitation Championship are ineligible to compete in any Hamel Foundation NHS Medal Class or the Finals.

Riders may compete, if qualified, in any ASPCA Maclay Regional Championship Class and in the Hamel Foundation National Horse Show 3'3" Equitation Championship in the same year.

Riders may not show in both the Hamel Foundation National Horse Show 3'3" Equitation Championship and the ASPCA Maclay Finals in the same competition year.

Horses that compete in the Hamel Foundation National Horse show 3'3" Equitation Championship or the THIS National Horse Show Adult Equitation Championship are eligible to compete in the Maclay National Championship Class.

Only one rider per horse.

The same horse must be used for all Rounds/Phases of the competition.

Trainers/Coaches permitted to ride and school competitors' horses.

Trainers/Coaches permitted to walk any and all courses with competitors.

In the event a horse becomes incapacitated in any phase of competition, upon examination of the Horse show's veterinarian and a judge or steward, a the substitution of a horse previously entered and checked in may be permitted by the National Horse Show.

Awards

The Judges will select a Champion and a Reserve Champion.

Ribbons through twelfth place.

Trophy to the Trainer of the winning rider.

Entries and Entry Closing Dates

For the closing date of entries, please refer to the National Horse Show prize list. Entries must be on the Official Entry Form, signed and submitted with the class entry fee made payable to the NHSAA. The NHSAA reserves the right to reject any late or unsigned entries or entries not submitted with all entry fees.

Questions and Disputes

Any questions or disputes relating to the qualifying classes or the Finals, other than that specifically described above, shall be decided according to the rules of the USEF, if applicable, or according to the Prize List if such question is not covered by the rules of the USEF.

THIS NHS ADULT MEDAL

Qualifying for THIS Finals at the Area Championship:

The Champion, Reserve Champion and Third place finisher from each THIS Area Championship, if not otherwise qualified, will receive invitations to compete in the Taylor Harris Insurance Services NHS 3'3" Equitation Finals provided they have points from competing in THIS Adult Equitation classes in the same competition year.

CLASS 607-ENTRY FEE \$85.00

QUALIFYING

To qualify for the Finals conducted by the NHSAA, contestants must win a total of ten points from THIS NHS Adult Medals. Points to be based on the scale of 10, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1 and ½ points for first through eight place in any THIS NHS Adult Medal. The qualifying period for each year's Finals ends August 31. If a horse show starts on or before August 31, THIS NHS Adult Medal Class points acquired at that show will count towards the current year.

FINALS

Two separate and distinct THIS NHS Adult Equitation Championships will be offered.

THIS NHS Adult Equitation Championship 18-24

THIS NHS Adult Equitation Championship 25 and Over

If qualified, past winners of the THIS NHS Adult Equitation Championship 18-24 will be allowed to compete in the THIS NHS Adult Equitation Championship 25 and Over.

Judging

To be judged on seat, hands, guidance, and control of the horse. Use of the open numerical system of judging not to be used.

First Round

To be shown over a special course of jumps set to the above stated specifications and posted one hour before the start of the class. The course for the Finals shall be designed by a USEF Course Designer who must be selected and/or approved by the NHSSA. The Judges for the Finals will have input and give approval on the course design.

Flat Phase

A minimum of twenty-four (24) riders, if available, are required to show at a walk, trot, and canter. At the sole discretion of the judges, additional flat work may be called for, but all groups must be asked to perform the same test. No more than twenty (20) riders at a time may be asked to work together. The flat performance of those riders selected to show in the flat phase shall count 50%. Changing of bit/bridle between phases is permissible.

Second Round

All riders who competed in the Flat Phase will be asked to return for a final round over a second course following the above listed specifications. The final round course may include tests.

Testing

Testing of up to six riders is optional using USEF Tests 1-23.

Conditions for holding the THIS NHS Adult Medal Finals

Horses that compete in the Hamel Foundation National Horse show 3'3" Equitation Championship or the THIS National Horse Show Adult Equitation Championship are eligible to compete in the Maclay National Championship Class.

Only one rider per horse.

The same horse must be used for all Rounds/Phases.

Two refusals will eliminate a rider from Finals competition.

Conventional tack per USEF EQ 105.5a. Martingales not permitted for the flat phase.

Trainers/Coaches permitted to ride and school competitors horses.

Trainers/Coaches permitted to walk any and all courses with competitors.

In the event a horse becomes incapacitated in any phase of competition, upon examination of the Horse show's veterinarian and a judge or steward, a substitution of a horse that has been previously entered and checked in may be permitted by the NHSAA.

Awards

The Judges will select a Champion and a Reserve Champion.

Ribbons through tenth place.

Trophy to the Trainer of the winning rider.

Entries and Entry Closing Dates

For the closing date of entries, please refer to the National Horse Show prize list. Entries must be on the Official Entry Form, signed and submitted with the class entry fee made payable to the NHSAA. The NHSAA reserves the right to reject any late or unsigned entries or entries not submitted with all entry fees.

Questions and Disputes

Any questions or disputes relating to the Championship, other than that specifically described above, shall be decided according to the rules of the USEF, if applicable, or according to the Prize List if such question is not covered by the rules of the USEF.

Schooling Area Protocol for Regionals and Finals

- Official schooling area will be set one hour before the start of the competition.
- Schooling fences will be set as a straight line of oxers across the middle of the official schooling area.
- Each jump will have at least four standards, four rails and four cups.
- Each jump must be flagged.
- Each jump may be set as an oxer.
- Each jump may be set as a vertical.
- Each jump may be set as a combination (Bounce, One Stride or Two Strides)
- Tarps (vinyl panels) and coolers are to be allowed. These may be used on the jump, under the jump or on the ground in front of or behind the jump. If they are used on the ground in front of or behind the jump they must be set on the ground a minimum of 9 feet and a maximum of 21 feet from the jump in either direction. They may not be set in such a way that they interfere with either the approach or landing of another jump.
- Straight lines may not be set.
- Bending lines may not be set.
- All other USEF Schooling Rules for the Equitation section will be enforced.

1. Leadline (No Entry Fee)

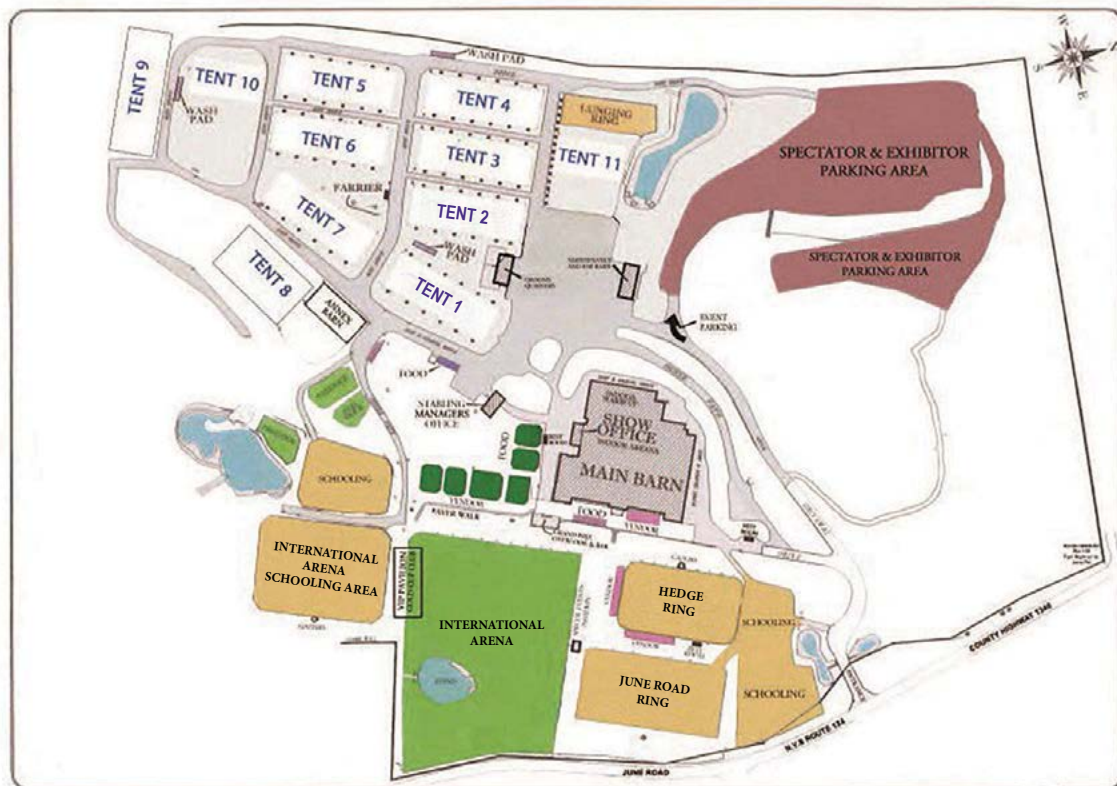

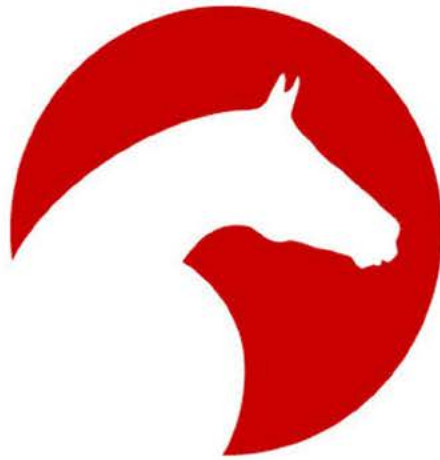

 - a) The "Statement of Health" must be signed and dated by a Licensed Veterinarian within seven (7) days of arrival of Old Salem Farm Show grounds.
 - b) The "Statement of Health" must show that the following horse:
 - 1) Been enrolled in a regular and consistent program of vaccination against EHV-1 with the most recent booster being within 180 days.
 - 2) Have not shown symptoms of or been treated for EHV-1 within the past 28 days.
 - 3) Have not been exposed to any horses or ponies that have been treated for or shown symptoms of EHV-1 within the past 28 days.
- 2) Negative Coggins within one year.
- 3) Horses traveling from other than New York State require a Certificate of Health.

HEALTH PROTOCOLS:

Please be mindful of routine biosecurity measures to prevent any potential spread of contagious diseases

Avoid nose to nose contact between horses from different stables.

Avoid shared or communal water buckets.

NOTE: Please feel free to contact our show veterinarian with any questions regarding these requirements.

These requirements have been drafted by the management from this horse show in consultation with our show veterinarian and the New York State division of Animal Industry.

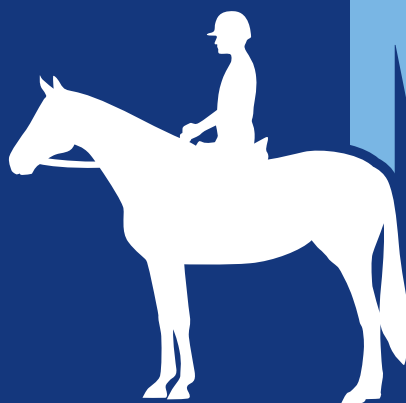

For and in consideration of United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. dba US Equestrian ("USEF") allowing me, the undersigned, to participate in any capacity (including as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, official, trainer or volunteer) in a USEF sanctioned, licensed or approved event or activity, including but not limited to equestrian clinics, practices, shows, competitions and related or incidental activities and _____ ("USEF Event" or "USEF Events"); I, for myself, and on behalf of my spouse, children, heirs and next of kin, and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors,, and assigns, hereby agree to and make the following contractual representations pursuant to this Agreement (the "Agreement"):

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree to be bound and abide by the rules, regulations, and policies of USEF as published in the USEF Rule Book and on the website at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time.

B.
